TRY WORKS. Developing the personal, life and employability skills needed to secure and maintain jobs and start careers that will earn participants a meaningful wage is our highest priority, and a key driver of successful reentry: Inability to find work and maintain an honest, livable wage is a leading cause of recidivism (a relapse that leads back to the criminal justice system and a return to prison).

In Ohio, 1 in 3 men released from prison go back. Through its unique, tailored process, TRY has built a reentry program that is proven and WORKS.

TRY's first-ever capital and capacity building campaign focuses appropriately on a "Work" theme: We WORK hard to provide tools and training for men we serve who must do the WORK needed to secure WORK that keeps them out of the system.

ABOUT TRY

TRY is a 501c3 non-profit organization providing a highimpact blend of services for some of our community's most marginalized individuals: men coming out of lengthy incarceration, the majority also challenged by addiction or substance abuse issues.

In 1999, Founder Perry Clark and his wife Lisa launched TRY with the donation and renovation of a 5-bedroom transitional home, providing entry-level construction skills training and mentoring to put men back on their feet after years of negative, unhealthy behaviors.

Today, TRY is a model for effective reentry programming across Akron, Summit County and the State of Ohio -- the organization and its partners are transforming lives and community.

TRY now offers 28 beds in 7 transitional sober homes, all renovated by men participating in the program. This ensures men a safe, healthy environment in which to heal and acclimate. A growing TRY staff (now 20 strong!) facilitates provision of basic needs, Peer Recovery and mentoring services, supplying the "reentry tools" men require to succeed.





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The construction skills training offered to TRY's earliest participants is now a burgeoning social-enterprise based, work-for-hire program and the organization's bedrock. Through dozens of partnerships, the Employment Skills Training program arms men with the hard and soft skills needed to get and keep jobs while serving as a steady, growing income base to support the reentry program.

- 75-150 men a year participate in short and longerterm training projects
- Skills training in 6 core areas
 - o Construction
 - o Lawncare/landscaping
 - o Commercial cleaning
 - o Logistics
 - o Leadership development
 - o Extended career skills

In 2021, a workforce development component was added to the Skills Training program that is shaping exciting future visions for this essential reentry component. Through a new partnership with conxusNEO and Stark State University, qualifying men served by TRY now have the opportunity for deepened professional development and education that puts them on a solid career track to well-paying and fulfilling employment.
